What is EIG CONCERT-Japan?

CONCERT-Japan is an international joint initiative to support, coordinate and enhance science, technology and innovation (STI) cooperation between European countries and Japan. It began as an ERA-NET project funded by the EU FP7 (2011-2014), and is now implemented independently of EU support as an activity of the European Interest Group.

What is the aim of the call?

The overall advancement of functional porous material technology is a global priority area, motivating this Call for Proposals to address material and application research in a combined holistic setting. Projects are to develop porous structure controlled material technology to address sustainability and other global priority problems. Through the design and control of nanoporous, supramolecular composite, PCP/MOF and other material structures, advanced functions and properties applicable to the storage, transportation, conversion and separation of energy and chemical resources, mitigation and removal of environmental contaminants and materials for medical care are envisioned.

Following an intensive topic evaluation period we are optimistic of receiving many proposals with high potential of extending cooperative leadership in this field.

Conditions:

Research projects with an innovative dimension will be funded for a period of 3 years in the field of Functional Porous Materials. The research projects are expected to have mobility and networking dimensions apart from the core research component. Each project consortium applying for this call should consist of at least 3 partners, 1 from Japan and 2 from two different European countries participating in the call.

The Joint Call will be funded by the budget allocated by each participating national/regional funding institutions. Therefore, each participating funding organisation reserves the right to apply its national/regional funding regulations.
